She is currently the clinical lead for the HIV department at Imperial and part of the inpatient team at Chelsea and Westminster Hospital. She completed an MD Research Degree at Imperial College exploring the cerebral effects of HIV and hepatitis C. Since then she has developed her area of interest in liver health in people with HIV; including viral hepatitis B/C and metabolic liver disease. She is lead author on the 2026 BASHH hepatitis guidelines and is part of the BHIVA liver guidelines writing group and the BHIVA Hepatitis Expert Advisory Group.</p>

It argues for a shift from equality to equity, emphasising culturally responsive care and service redesign to better meet the needs of racially minoritised communities.</p> <p>Learning Objectives:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recognise patterns of racial inequality in sexual health presentations • Apply an intersectional approach to clinical assessment, tailoring history-taking, risk assessment, and prevention strategies (e.g. testing, PrEP, vaccination) to better meet the needs of racially minoritise patients • Identify and implement practical changes in service delivery to improve access, trust and outcomes for racially minoritised communities 	<p>Dwayne-Wilson Hunt Dwayne-Wilson (He/Him) is a London-based, Black-British Specialist Nurse working in sexual health and HIV, currently undertaking a Masters in Advanced Clinical Practice and is guest lecturer at King’s College London.</p> <p>He works at one of Europe’s busiest HIV clinics and previously chaired BASHH’s Racially Minoritised Communities Special Interest Group (2021–2024). In 2022 he was awarded the RCN Rising Star Award. He’s collaborated/worked with BBC, WHO, LSHTM, CoSRH and contributed to the LUSTRUM2 project.
