## **Speaker Biographies**

### **Sarah Allstaff**

Dr Sarah Allstaff is a Consultant in Genitourinary Medicine within NHS Tayside based in Dundee, Scotland. She is Clinical Lead for HIV and also provides care within the local multidisciplinary vulval dermatology service. Sarah is an honorary Senior Lecturer for the University of Dundee where she is lead for the final year of their MBChB programme and students.

### **Andy Borman**

Professor Andy Borman is Head of UKHSA's National Mycology Reference Laboratory in Bristol which he joined in 2003 and an Honorary Professor at the University of Exeter. His research interests include emerging fungal pathogens and neglected tropical diseases caused by filamentous fungi, diagnosis and management of fungal infections, molecular and proteomic identification of pathogenic fungi and fungal taxonomy, phylogenetics and nomenclature. Prior to joining the MRL, he was a senior research scientist at the Pasteur Institute, France (1992-2003). Andy has published over 200 peer-reviewed papers and book chapters, is a current editor for Medical Mycology, a fellow of the ECMM and a member of the CLSI Antifungal subcommittee, the BSMM and several ISHAM working groups.

### **Maria-Angeliki Gkini**

Dr. Maria-Angeliki Gkini qualified from the Medical School of Aristotle University in Thessaloniki, Greece. She is an MSc holder in International Medicine-Health Crisis Management and she completed her PhD, focusing on the management of hair diseases. She completed her dermatology training at Barts Health NHS Trust in London, where she developed an interest in inflammatory skin diseases. She further pursued her clinical and research interests in Athens, Greece and in New York City, USA. She was an IPC Fellow 2023 and she is a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians.

Currently, she is a Locum Consultant Dermatologist at Barts Health NHS Trust, London and an Honorary Senior Lecturer at Queen Mary University, London, UK. She is running the specialist psoriasis, atopic dermatitis as well as the specialist hair clinic. Her special interests include inflammatory skin and hair diseases, advanced therapies (biologics and small molecules) and psychodermatology. Apart from her clinical work, Dr Gkini has an interest in clinical research and she has been a principal and sub-investigator in more than 50 multicenter studies. She has significant teaching experience, including teaching at the Postgraduate Diploma in Clinical Dermatology at Queen Mary University in London.

Dr Gkini is actively involved in several organisations and societies and their committees, such as the EADV, the ESDAP, the IPC and Alopecia UK. She has participated in numerous national and international congresses as a speaker/invited speaker and she has published her research in international peer-reviewed journals. Dr Gkini has also been awarded numerous prizes and grants by

prestigious institutions and organisations, such as the EADV, the BAD and the Royal College of Physicians.

### **Rebeca Goiriz**

Dr Rebeca Goiriz is a Consultant Dermatologist at Barts Health NHS Trust and Honorary Senior Clinical Lecturer at Queen Mary University.
