Breakout Sessions – Synopses

Friday 7th September

HIV: A patient's perspective - Lizzie Jordan

What is it like to be a patient living with HIV have you ever considered what patients want from their clinicians. What are the issues which an HIV patient would like us to address/ how can we do better?

HIV for beginners - Tara Suchak

Tara will take you through management of a patient with HIV from initial diagnosis to routine follow up. This workshop is aimed at people who may see HIV patients in their GUM or contraceptive role but are not currently or who may have only recently become involved in the day to day care of HIV patients.

Challenges GU case studies - Rita Browne

Always a popular workshop you will discuss complex cases which you may come across in the clinic. It is always useful to see how others address problems and to see if you agree.

Hepatitis update - Ben Stone

Hepatitis serology often confuses clinicians. This workshop will help you understand the necessary tests and their interpretation.

Many of us are approaching that age. However whatever stage you are at you should be considering your retirement plans. Aidan will give us some tips and useful advice.

Contraception in women with complex medical conditions - Vinod Kumar

Vulval pain syndromes - Jane Hussey

Post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and psychosexual function - Michael Yates

SD can have a significant impact on sexual function and the ability to maintain intimate relationships. How can we better detect PTSD in clinical practice, and what can we ask patients to understand more about potential post-traumatic symptoms in their sexual lives?

Male genital dermatology - Imali Fernando

We all see dermatological conditions affecting the genitals are you confident that you can recognise common and not so common conditions. Do you know how to manage common dermatological conditions? If you are unsure or you would like an update then this workshop is for you.

Career progression and educational needs in SAS group - Naila Kamal

Do you sometimes wonder where your career is heading? Do you feel you get sufficient opportunities to progress your career? Are your educational needs catered for? Come and discuss some of these issues at this interactive workshop

Rectal presentations - John McSorley

STIs can present with rectal symptoms. Do you think about all possibilities when screening patients? This workshop will help to raise your awareness about conditions affecting the rectum.

Sexual health in Women who have sex with other women (WSW) - Alison Barbour

Do you know which issues are pertinent to WSW? Do you discuss risks of infection and cervical screening with your WSW patients? What should we be thinking about and discussing with our patients?

Disgust, aversion and anxiety: Treating the effects of trauma on sexual

functions - Agnes Kocsis

Agnes is part of the St Mary's Multidisciplinary Team who has pioneered the use of Mindfulness as a core element in therapy for sexual functioning. She is interested in how psychological theory can be brought more actively into sex therapy, especially models of conditioning and disgust.
