13:10 – 13:50	Lecture 2: PrEP Injectable PrEP offers opportunities to reach populations who are currently under-represented in PrEP user cohorts but involves significant costs and practical challenges. The 2025 BASHH/BHIVA Guidelines use recent evidence to allow new oral PrEP dosing options for all users, and the taking of PrEP tablets after a potential exposure. These can increase PrEP equity but may raise concerns about efficacy for users and clinicians.
