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



Detection Rate Indicator




- June 2013: Public Health Outcome Framework Health protection indicator (Detection rate indicator)
 - ≥ 2,300 diagnoses per 100,000




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


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Total costs for Chlamydia Screening activities in Leeds Financial years 2010/11 to 2015/16



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


Chlamydia testing data for 15–24 year olds **Proportion of tests by testing service type** Leeds, Y& H and England 2013
